The Associate coursework provides the rationale for using the OG approach with individuals with dyslexia. Components of the course include the neurobiology of dvslexia and evidence-based reading instruction. It provides a diagnosticprescriptive approach to assessment, instructional sequences, and lesson planning delivery for the individual learner. An Associate Level A member is qualified to provide 1:1 instruction under the mentorship of an Academy Fellow.

Optional - Practicum

The practicum is for those who want to attain the Associate Level A certification from the Orton-Gillingham Academy (OGA). The practicum consists of a minimum of 100-hours working 1:1 with a student (10 observations conducted over 8 consecutive months) at a cost of \$150 for each video observation with constructive feedback.

The OGA does not offer accreditation without a practicum.

Virtual Orton-Gillingham Academy Training

What is dyslexia? Dyslexia is an *unexpected* difficulty in reading and writing, in an individual who has the intelligence to be a much better reader and writer. It is a struggle to hear the patterns in words and see the patterns in words.

What is OG? Orton-Gillingham (OG) is a powerful approach to teaching reading and spelling that engages multiple pathways in the brain to help students learn with success. OG instruction is explicit, multisensory, sequential, structured, cumulative, individualized, and phonics based. The Orton-Gillingham approach is considered the gold standard of instruction for students with dyslexia and other language-based learning disabilities because it is a highly individualized approach that demystifies the English language by explicitly explaining the *how* and *why*.

The Orton-Gillingham approach is frequently associated with a tutorial setting but it can also be a valuable part of small group instruction.
