About Training

Few colleges and universities provide instruction in the Orton-Gillingham Approach. Training is most readily found elsewhere. However, the quality and adequacy of training represented as "Orton-Gillingham" may vary significantly. Indeed, one of the reasons the Orton-Gillingham Academy came into being was to provide an objective, professional assessment, by an independent third party, of the quality and adequacy of programs that profess to provide Orton-Gillingham training. The Academy is not in a position to judge the qualifications of non-Academy members, but it can speak with authority regarding its membership.

Orton-Gillingham Training Includes:

- The nature of the dyslexic learner
- Knowledge of basic assessment measures
- Understanding of reading development from decoding to reading for knowledge
- The OG Approach: principles and knowledge of lesson plan design
- Knowledge of the history and structure of the language
- Intensive supervised practicum
- Understanding the neurobiology of reading

OGA Certification

The Training & Certification Process

The Academy certifies individuals at one of four levels:

- **Classroom Educator** (CE) practitioner is certified to provide and adapt literacy instruction for the whole class or for small groups needing supplemental support in a general setting.
- Associate Level is certified to work with struggling readers of all ages, including those with dyslexia, in individual or group settings.
- **Certified Level** The Certified level expands and deepens the Associate Level concepts and equips the practitioner with the skills to address the needs of struggling readers of all ages, including those with dyslexia and more complex learning profiles, in any setting.

A bachelor's degree in any area of study is a prerequisite for CE, Associate, and Certified levels.

• **Fellow Level** The Fellow Level prepares practitioners to design and deliver OG training courses at all levels of OGA certification.

A master's degree in any area of study is a prerequisite for the Fellow level.

In addition, there is a **Subscriber** membership for people who have taken a basic introduction to the Orton-Gillingham Approach but who have yet to undertake the training and practice required to become a certified member of the Academy.

OPTIONS FOR TRAINING

There are two options that lead to Academy certification and membership:

1. Working with individual Fellow(s)

Fellows of the Academy have been certified as having the training and experience necessary to independently train others in the OG Approach.

Fellows follow the Academy's curriculum and are expected to provide instruction consistent with the highest standards.

<u>2. Enrolling in an Academy Accredited</u> <u>Training Program or an Accredited Training</u> Fellow

The Academy accredits training programs to train individuals aspiring to become Orton-Gillingham practitioners. The instructional leadership of the program must be a Fellow of the Academy.

Academy criteria for accreditation of an Orton-Gillingham practitioner training program emphasizes the adequacy of curricula used by a program and the preparation and experience of the staff providing the training.

COURSEWORK AND PRACTICUM

Each level requires a certain amount of coursework hours and supervised practicum.

APPLICATION

After completing the requirements, the Academy requires the submission of an application. If training is completed through an Academy Accredited Training Program, or by an Accredited Training Fellow, the application process is considered as an Accredited Training Track and accepted on a rolling basis.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

- March 10
- July 10
- November 10

NOTIFICATION

Decision letters are mailed approximately three months after submission.
