The OGA does not offer accreditation without a practicum.

OG instruction is explicit, multisensory, sequential, structured, cumulative, individualized, and phonics based. The Orton-Gillingham approach is considered the gold standard of instruction for students with dyslexia and other language-based learning disabilities because it is a highly individualized approach that demystifies the English language by explicitly explaining the *how*

The Orton-Gillingham approach is frequently associated with a tutorial setting but it can also be a valuable part of small group instruction.
